

# Overview

- Biological Evaluation (BE) – FWS Midwest Region completed their review and issued a biological opinion pursuant to section 7(a)(2) of the Endangered Species Act for the USCG D9.
- Unanticipated Discovery Plan – RRT workgroup drafted template plan that can be used in ACPs; additional material including field guide and MOA for data sharing are also being considered; distributing for review and comment.
- Historic Property Specialist Training – Late March training postponed due to weather; looking to reschedule before the end of the 2024 calendar year.

# Overview

- Quad City Exercise – June 24-26. RRT5 and RRT7. TTX in Le Claire, IA. Identify concerns, coordination, and improvements in spill preparedness and planning in the subarea.

# Laws/Regulations/Policies

- DOI/OEPC is working on revising internal Pollution Removal Funding Authorizations guidance; process for setting up reimbursable agreements between DOI bureaus and OSC when DOI expertise is requested on a response.

# Agency Organization Chart



National Ocean Service Organization Chart







- Provides pipeline safety information that addresses barriers to equal opportunity, enhances community engagement, and expands our presence within disadvantaged communities
- Utilizes the DOT Social Equity Tool, which combines elements of the U.S. Census Tract Map, Excavation Damages Hot Spot map, the National Pipeline Mapping System and US Census Information






- RRT5's Inland Sensitivity Atlas (ISA) provides contingency planners and emergency responders with accurate and relevant information for spill preparedness and response
- The ISA Tribal Lands and Interests layer maps reservations and off-reservation lands that could contain significant cultural, environmental and economic resources that are vulnerable to spill damage

# Tribal information in RRT interactive mapping tools




- The Tribal Lands and Interests layer includes details about locations, associated waterbodies, and emergency contacts
- Tribal resource managers are surveyed to ensure that the mapped areas and details are accurate when each layer is updated (~ every 3 years)



- On January 17, 2024, EPA announced updates to guidance for lead in residential soil at CERCLA (also known as Superfund) sites and Resource Conservation and Recovery Act corrective action facilities.
