Key Operational Activities	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Contain leading edge to keep crude out of Mississippi River. • Wildlife recovery and rehabilitation of captured wildlife • Recovery of material was hampered due to weather and type of material spilled. • 8.5 miles of Cahokia Creek impacted, proper management of Divisions, SCAT identified locations to be cleaned, poling assessment to determine if there was a possibility of submerged oil.
