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What is a JIC



- Part of the Joint Information System (JIS) (page 4)
- Joint Information Center (JIC) Central location where multi agencies work together to disseminate incident information to the media and community
- Should be established early on, especially if there is more than 1 agency responding.
- If not, lack of public information will become a lessons learned item on your hot wash

What is a JIC Model

History of the NRT JIC Model – All Hazards compatible with NIMS– Used before there is a national declaration

Used before there is a national declaration

The public and media expect transparency of information

Revisions



- Better designed- easy to read -usable
- ICS/NIMS driven
- PIO workgroup from CG, Industry, EPA and other NRT agencies
- Consulted with State, Local, Federal, Tribal
- Included plans from FEMA, State Agencies, GSA, U.S. Fire Service, EPA, CG and DHS (page 5)
- Includes checklists, social media, samples

JIC Model Section I



- Page 1-4
- Purpose of the JIC plan for public information
- Not a regulation, it is a voluntary model to guide public information officers when responding to an incident
- As close to a field guide helps PIO's with a structure that works within the framework of NIMS and ICS
- NIMS IS -702, FEMA pub 517, NIMS IS-250 (ESF-15) All are JIC structures
