RRT SOP: Background & Overview

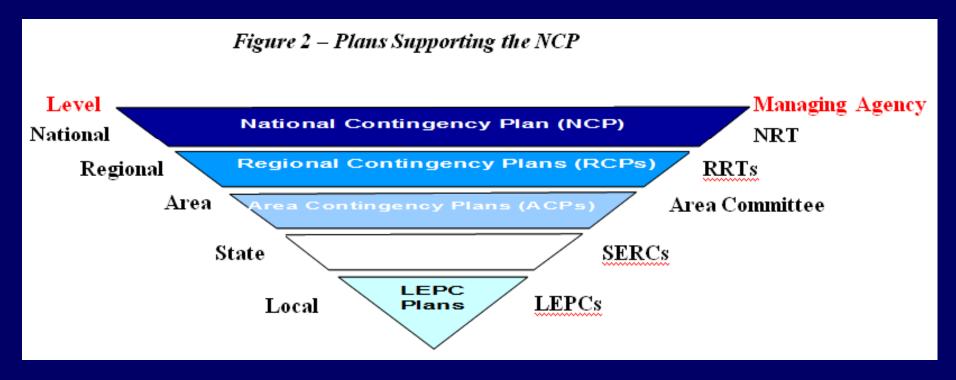
- Purpose: to provide RRT Co-chairs, Coordinators and staff with guidance of their roles and responsibilities; can be used as an orientation guide
- National Response System
 - NRT, 13 RRTs, FOSCs/OSCs, State & Local govts, & NRC
 - Provides resources, technical assistance, policy guidance in support of FOSCs
 - Authorized by
 - National Oil & Hazardous Substances Pollution Contingency Plan (NCP), 40 CFR §300
 - Clean Water Act (CWA) 33 USC §1251
 - Resource Conservation and Recovery Act (RCRA), 42 USC §6901
 - Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation, & Liability Act (CERCLA), 42 USC §9601
 - Emergency Planning and Community Right-to-Know Act (EPCRA), 42 USC §11001 or Superfund Amendments and Reauthorization Act (SARA) Title III

Preparedness



RRT SOP: The RRT – Standing RRT

Responsibilities:

- Recommend revisions to the NCP
- Evaluate preparedness of agencies
- Provide technical assistance to response community
- Evaluate regional & local responses; review OSC actions
- Encourage state & local response community to improve preparedness
- Conduct advance planning for use of chemical agents (dispersants, surface washing, surface collecting, burning, bioremediation)
- Be prepared to provide resources to major discharges or releases outside the region
- Conduct/participate in training and exercises, ensure participation in national exercises
- Meet semi-annually to review response actions, consider changes in RCPs and recommend changes in ACPs
- Provide annual report to NRT (recent responses, concerns, coordination efforts)
- Encourage outreach to private industry for training and education

RRT SOP: The RRT

- Incident -Specific RRT
 - Responsibilities:
 - Support the FOSC
 - Monitor the response
 - Coordinate to resolve issues
 - Provide comms support
 - Advise FOSC on chemical countermeasures
 - Assist with mobilizing resources
 - Provide approval decision for use of dispersants, in situ burning, or other chemical treatment agents
 - Request assistance from NRT if necessary

RRT SOP: Incident-Specific RRT cont'd

- RRT Chair may activate when release/discharge
 - Exceeds response capability available to OSC/RPM
 - Transects state boundaries
 - May pose substantial threat to public health, environment, or regional significant amounts of property
 - Is a worst case discharge
 - Upon request of OSC/RPM

RRT SOP: Incident-Specific RRT cont'd

- Upon activation, RRT may
 - Monitor and evaluate OSC reports, recommend response actions
 - Request resources
 - Help with public info releases, comms with NRT
 - If necessary, recommend that agency provide a different OSC
- Multi-Agency Coordination Group (MAC Group)
 - Decision making, resource allocation, prioritize incidents

RRT SOP: The RRT

- Role during ESF #10 Response
 - Coordinate with ESF lead
 - Participate in Joint Field Office (JFO) or FEMA
 Regional Response Coordination Center (RRCC)
 - Leverage action/discussion regarding use of Stafford Act for funding ESF #10 activities

RRT SOP: The RRT

RRT Membership

- Agencies whose regional subdivisions do not correspond to the standard federal regions may designate additional reps
- Federal: EPA, USCG, USDA, NOAA, DOD, DOE, HHS,
 DOI, DOJ, DOL/OSHA, DOS, DOT, FEMA, GSA, USNRC
- State: Environmental agencies, emergency management officials
- Tribal
- Local: industry, environmental orgs, civic groups

RRT SOP: Responsibilities

RRT Coordinators

- Coordinate between Co-Chairs and RRT membership
- Coordinate between RRT and NRT
- Meeting support
 - Plan logistics & agenda
 - Assist at meetings
 - Ensure minutes/summary distributed
- Support Co-Chairs, Workgroups
- Draft annual RRT report
- Coordinate w/ Liaison Officer at incidents
- Respond to information requests from the public and agencies
- Administrative duties: track CERCLA funding
- Attend annual NRT and RRT Co-Chairs meeting

RRT SOP: Responsibilities

RRT Co-Chairs

- Provide management & leadership to RRT
- Meetings
 - Approve agenda
 - Assign tasks to workgroups
 - Identify & present best practices and lessons learned
- Support NRT & NRT projects
- Ensure RRT progress on annual workplan
- Review & approve annual report
- Attend annual NRT and RRT Co-Chairs meeting
- Keep RRT membership informed of incident development, and activate Incident-Specific RRT if needed
- Monitor/evaluate FOSC reports
- Ensure RRT receives updates on ACPs
- Liaison with state & local government, special interest groups, industry
