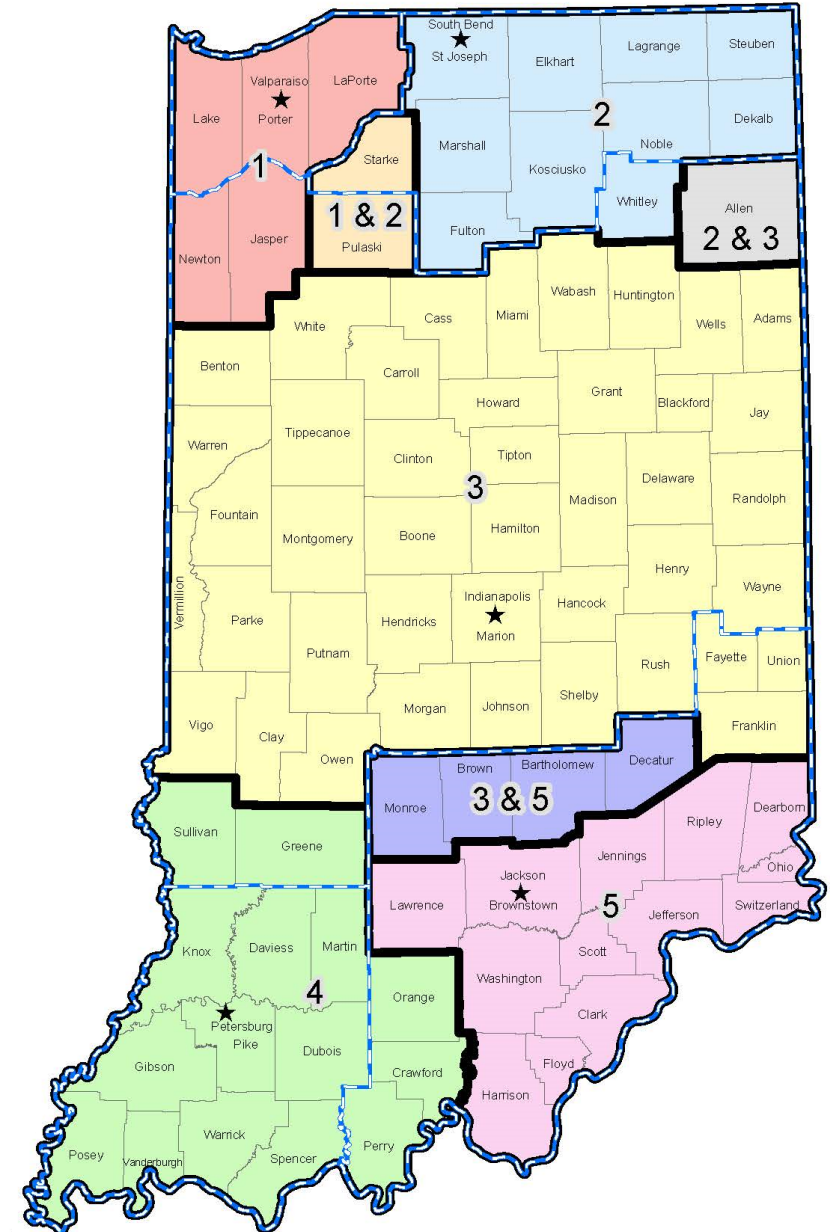

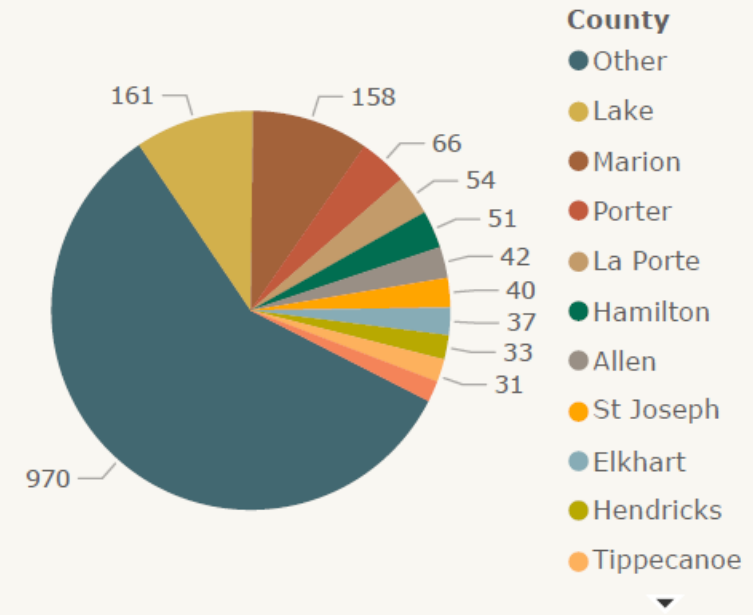

Spill Type Count

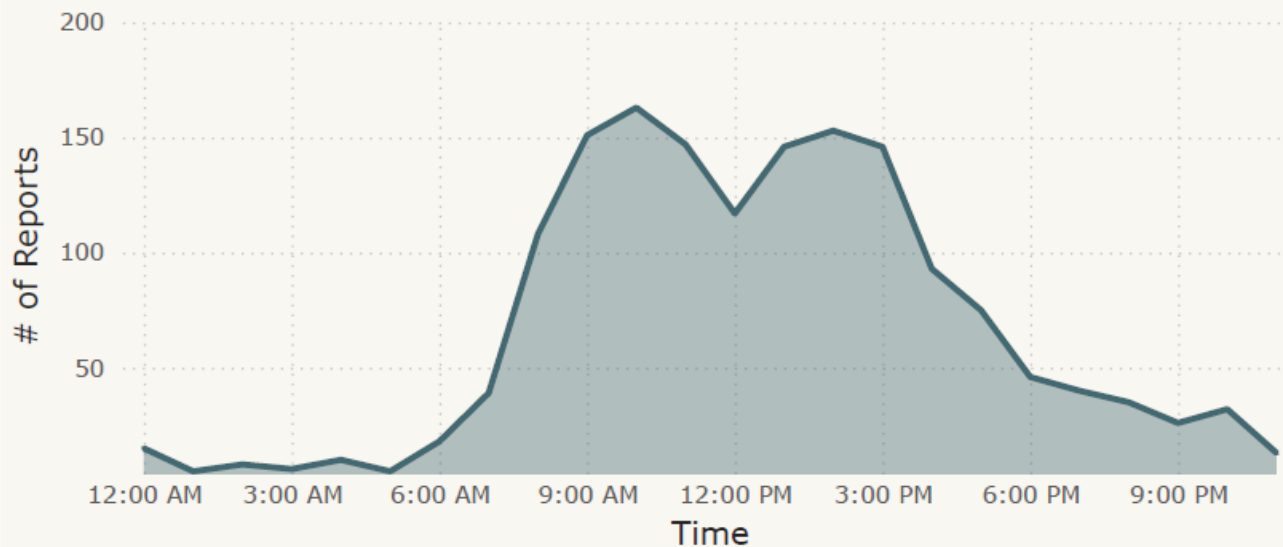

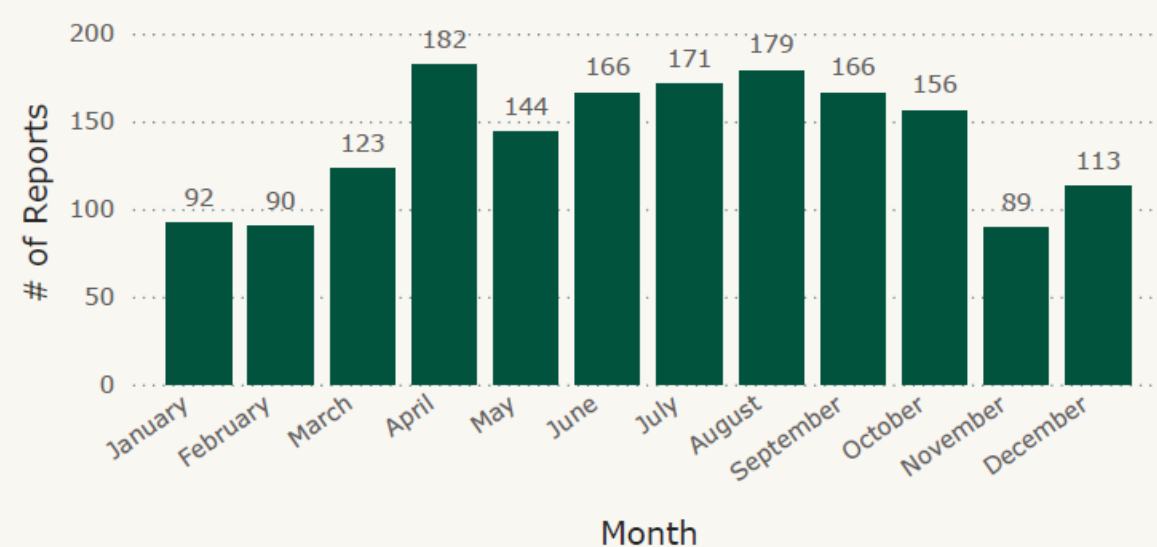
Count of Incidents by County



Number of Reports Received Hourly

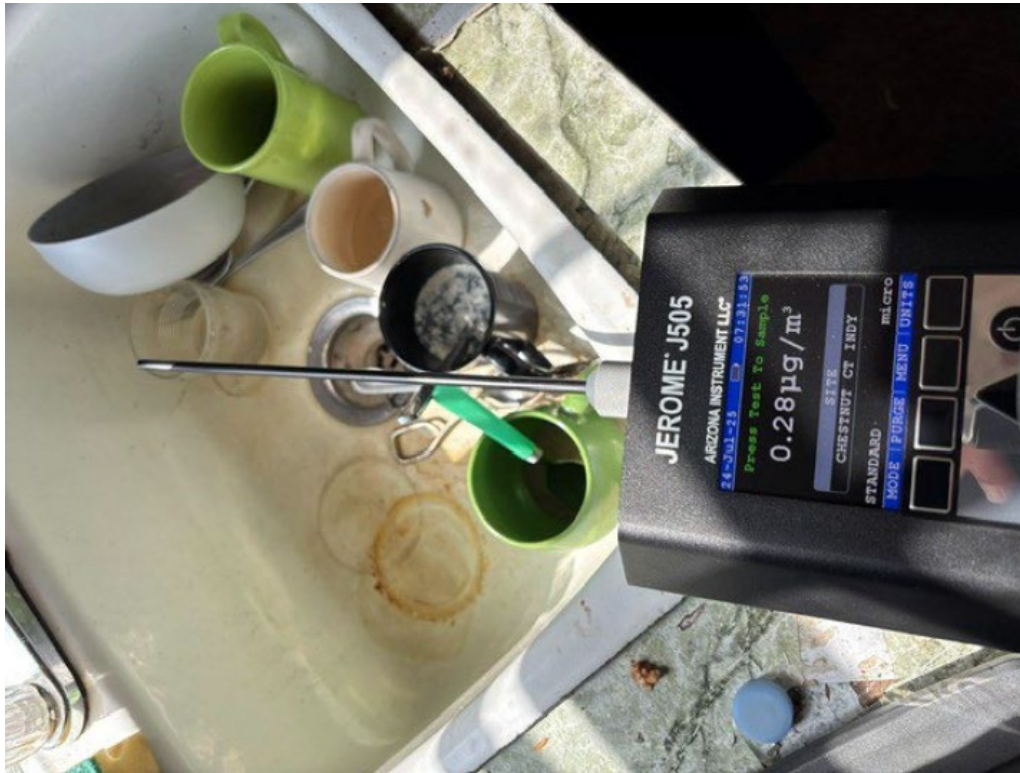


Number of Reports Received Monthly

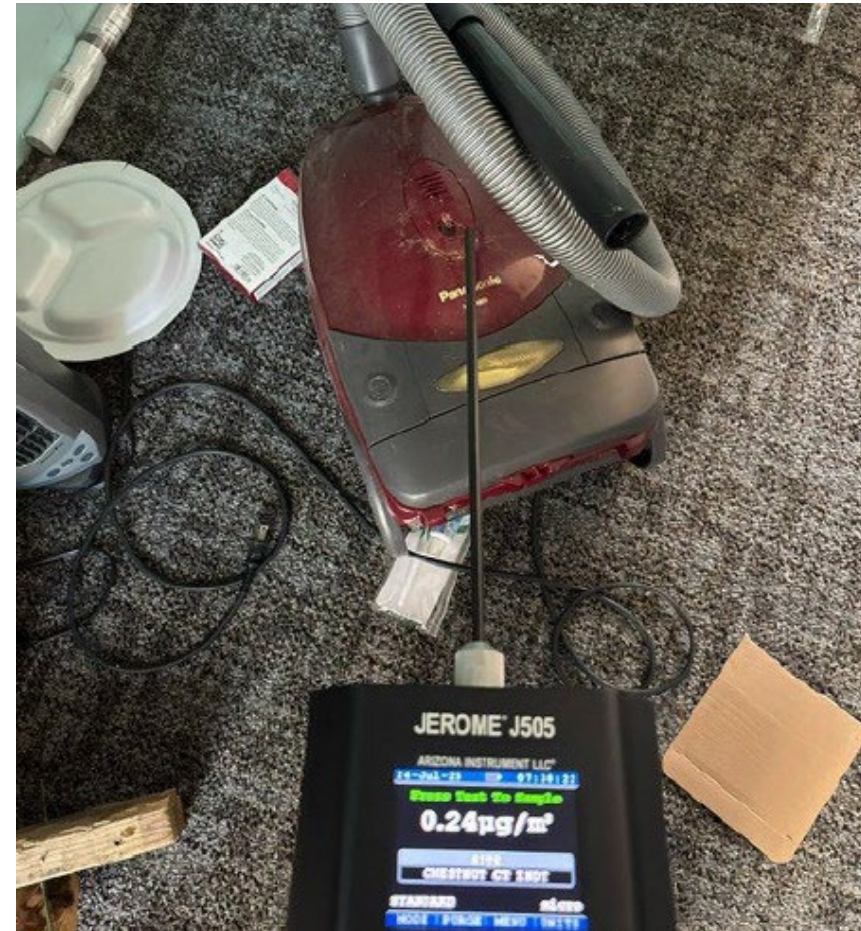

| Key Operational Activities | Reported by Poison Control Center. LHD and IDEM worked with property owner to gain access to screen property. Renter(RP) was uncooperative. EPA involved on an advisory level. Screenings done on two separate days (IDEM and IDOH). Levels in house were below cleanup goal. |
| Agencies Involved | Elkhart Health Department, Elkhart County Corrections, IDEM, Indiana Dept. of Health, EPA, Poison Control |
| Major Lessons Learned | Allow residence to be closed up for awhile before screening. Communication and cooperation with partnering agencies is vital. |

| Type and Amount of Product Spilled | Oil from Ecocentric entered WWTP causing biological treatment die off. |
| Cause of Spill | Ecocentric facility floor was covered in spilled oil and drained to the sanitary sewer. Biodiesel waste in the property's retention pond. Oil water separators and secondary containment structures had large amounts of spilled material. |
| Key Operational Activities | 2 divisions setup (Waterloo WWTP and Ecocentric Property). WWTP brought back to service with activated sludge. WWTP worked with IDEM Wastewater staff. Ecocentric cut off and capped the outlet from the retention pond to prevent waste from leaving the site. Installed lockable valves on secondary containment structures. Cleaned and recovered all spilled material. |
| Agencies Involved | IDEM, EPA, Dekalb Co EMA/DHS, and Town of Waterloo |
| Major Lessons Learned | Extra engagement with ER to involve various IDEM programs early in the process for positive results. |

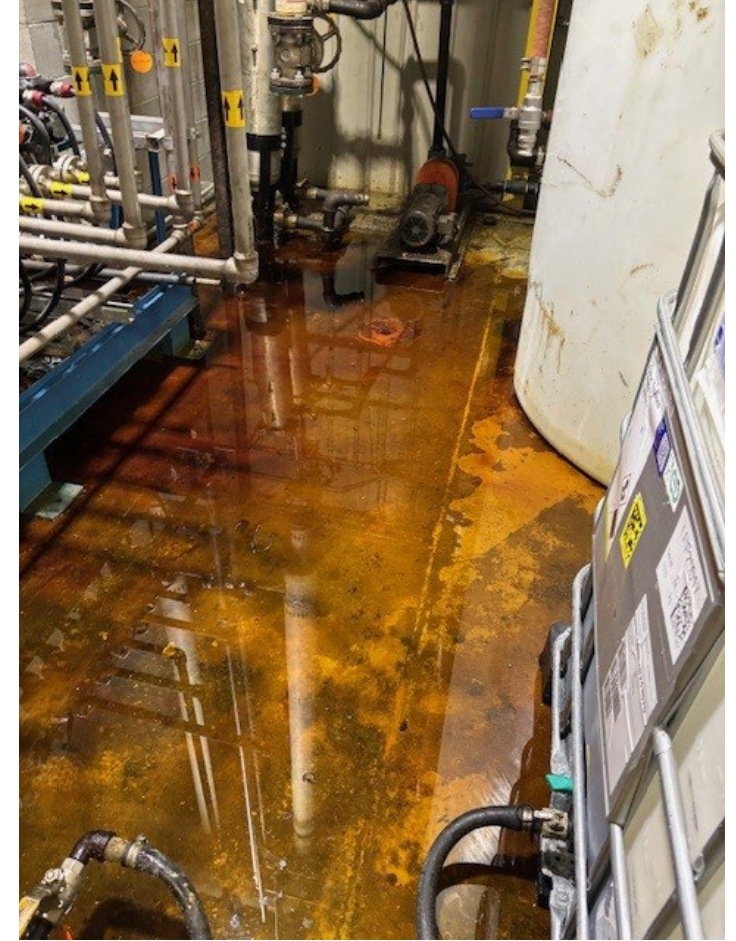
