


My Way Trading Warehouse Fire Jeffrey Wawczak





Initial Information and Deployment

- At 1430 on April 11, 2023, two warehouses (100,000 square feet) containing large amounts of chipped, shredded, and bulk recycled plastic caught fire in Richmond, Wayne County, Indiana. A smoke plume was visible in Montgomery County Ohio, which is approximately 30 miles to the east of Richmond.
- A 0.5-mile evacuation zone was established by the Richmond Fire Department and shelter-in-place order was issued for beyond the 0.5-mile limit.
- U.S. EPA conducted air monitoring and sampling in the city of Richmond. U.S. EPA also conducted air monitoring near New Paris, Ohio. Mobile air monitoring locations were chosen based on wind direction.
- Air monitoring at some ground level locations detected particulate matter, as expected from a fire.




Initial Information and Deployment Continued...

- The city of Richmond and IDEM were in the lead for managing water runoff from the scene.
- The city collected surface water samples at the Middle Fork East Fork Whitewater River and shared results with U.S. EPA.
- EPA collected debris sample results to determine whether asbestos-containing materials may have left the site.
- Residents were reminded to leave any debris alone and not touch it.
- The wind was going out to the WSW and pushed the plume in the direction of the State of Ohio





Demobilization

- On 4/18 the Chief of the Richmond Fire Department declared the fire officially out.
- The evening of 4/18 was the last day air monitoring was conducted. Air monitoring was discontinued the morning of 4/19.
- EPA completed fire debris collection on 5/4/2023 with 330 properties cleaned and passing final inspection. 28 Right of Way areas were also cleaned and inspected. Finally, 512 locations were identified as having no observable ACM fire debris.


